

Topic: To the ends of the Earth

Understand

- U4.5.5. Explain how the one, holy, Catholic, and apostolic Church is structured.

- U4.5.7. Describe what is meant by the 'communion of saints' and recognise that the Church teaches Mary has a special place within this communion as Queen of Heaven.

Discern

Reflecting on the story of Peter, share their ideas and listen to the ideas of others about what his life teaches Christians today.</p> <p>The Gospel tells us that John waited for Peter to arrive and then went into the tomb, he saw, and he believed.</p> <p>Why did Jesus ask Peter the same question three times?</p> <p>TB P52 – listen to the recording (Easter Sunday).</p> <p>PB P122-126 – The Empty Tomb & Jesus Appears.</p> <p>Possible tasks – Hot seat Peter Peter's journey of faith (questions on PB P126) Questions from PB P126</p>	<p>U4.5.3. Explain the term 'apostle' and explain why the Church is 'apostolic'.</p> <p>The Apostles wanted everyone to know about Jesus: his life, his death, his resurrection, and most of all that he is the Messiah, he is God.</p> <p>Explain Jesus made Peter the leader of the Apostles.</p> <p>TB P53 PPTs (Apostles Creed & Mission to the World)</p> <p>Learn how the church is Apostolic – Jesus built his church on the foundation that is the faith of the apostles.</p> <p>Possible tasks – The twelve apostles (worksheet TB P53) What does the word apostle mean? Reflect on Peter's life, children to write what they know/have learned about Peter. Thoughts that Peter might have had.</p>	<p>U4.5.6. Describe some ways in which the Church today (locally or globally) continues the work of Jesus.</p> <p>The Church need young people who are like the first Christians and radiate enthusiasm and courage for the mission of Jesus.</p> <p>Meaning of the word Church (TB P54)</p> <p>Learn the Apostles' Creed – look at images including stained glass windows (PB P133). Discuss what we believe.</p> <p>CST links to church – Common Good.</p> <p>Learn the structure of the church (how the Catholic church is structured – Pope, Bishops, Priests, etc).</p> <p>Possible tasks – Imagine a friend wants to know about your Church. What would you tell them? Guided tour of Parish church. Summarise the central beliefs of Catholics.</p>	<p>U4.5.7. Describe what is meant by the 'communion of saints' and recognise that the Church teaches Mary has a special place within this communion as Queen of Heaven.</p> <p>Explain the "communion of Saints" is made up of all people who place their hope in Jesus and belong to him through Baptism.</p> <p>Study imagery PB P138 (class discussion or possible task) Research some Saints and Feast days of Saints.</p> <p>Possible tasks – Make a list of Saints you know about. Describe what the Communion of Saints is. Who are Holy Souls? Why does Mary have a special place in heaven?</p>	<p>U4.5.6. Why is she important?</p> <p>Split into several lessons (The Annunciation, Visitation, Magnificat, Birth of Jesus, Loss in the Temple) up to Jesus' death. PB P141-143 (The above stories of Mary)</p> <p>Possible tasks – What can we learn from Mary? What was Mary's response from God? How can we be like Mary today? Magnificat artwork</p>	<p><i>Only 5 sections for this topic - could continue work on Mary.</i></p> <p>D4.5.3. Saying why they like either an artistic representation of Mary or a prayer or hymn, giving reasons for their answer. Listen to the responses of others.</p> <p>Mary after Jesus' death (crucifixion, devotion to Mary, Our Lady of Guadalupe) PB 144-146</p> <p>Focus on Mary and make links to Saint Mary's. Recall what a Saint is and why Mary is a Saint. Learn the story Our Lady of Fatima.</p> <p>Possible tasks – Mary artwork Analyse images of Mary (different representations) TB P56 PPT Artistic images of Mary Prayers for Mary (rosary links) Research shrines to Mary</p>
