

Topic: To the ends of the Earth

Understand

- U1.5.1. Retell with increasing detail one of the following accounts: the Road to Emmaus (Lk 24:13-35), the Promise of the Spirit and the Ascension (Acts 1:1-11), Pentecost (Acts 2:1-4).
- U1.5.2. Simply sequence the story of Jesus studied from earlier branches (as Luke does in Acts 1:1).
- U1.5.3. Make simple connections between the mission of the Church and the mission of Jesus as he announced it at the beginning of Luke's Gospel (Lk 4:16-19). (See branch 3.)
- U1.5.4. Recognise that Catholics celebrate the Ascension of Jesus and Pentecost on special days called holydays. (RVE)

Discern

- D1.5.1. Imagining how the apostles felt during the events following the Resurrection.
- D1.5.2. Talking about the different ways experience of the Holy Spirit is expressed in some of the stories from the Bible they have heard across the Year One branches (e.g., 'God's spirit hovered over the water' (Gen 1:1), a shadow in the Annunciation (Lk 1:35), or wind and fire in Pentecost (Acts 2:1-4)).
- D1.5.3. Looking at and discussing ways the Holy Spirit is described in art or music. (RVE)
- D1.5.4. Listening to and asking questions about the experiences of how others celebrate Pentecost in different places and cultures. (RVE)

Respond

- R1.5.1. Thinking about why prayer is an important part of life for many people. (RVE)
- R1.5.2. Hearing the words of the Glory Be and hymns that reference Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and joining in prayerfully if they choose to do so.

<p>U1.5.2. Simply sequence the story of Jesus studied from earlier branches (as Luke does in Acts 1:1).</p> <p>Big Book P26 – Easter Sunday. Look at what church is like on Easter Sunday. Discuss children's experiences of church. Discuss children's Easter experiences and which parts of Easter include Jesus. Discuss being with family.</p> <p>What do we celebrate at Easter? What does Resurrection mean? Explain to children that Jesus really died on the cross and rose again. Jesus appeared to the disciples several times.</p> <p>Possible tasks – Make an Easter Sunday card. Make an Easter Garden (plants, box for empty tomb, stones, white cloth). Imagery of Risen Jesus – what do we believe?</p>	<p>U1.5.1. Retell with increasing detail one of the following accounts: the Road to Emmaus (Lk 24:13-35), the Promise of the Spirit and the Ascension (Acts 1:1-11), Pentecost (Acts 2:1-4).</p> <p>Introduction activity - How do you think you would feel if a good friend was leaving school and not coming back? Luke 24:13-35</p> <p>Big Book P27 – Use pictures and ask questions from the big book about the road to Emmaus. Find out about Jesus' friends who were feeling sad and make links to introduction questions and our own feelings.</p> <p>TB P131 – PPT & worksheet</p> <p>Possible tasks – Retell the story of Emmaus Hot seating disciples & Jesus Write to one of the disciples who was missing & tell him what happened at Supper with Jesus.</p>	<p>U1.5.4. Imagining how the apostles felt during the events following the Resurrection.</p> <p>Key questions – why do you think Jesus had to go back to heaven? What do you think God said to Jesus when he went back to heaven? What do you think his friends thought when he left?</p> <p>Big Book P28 – Picture of the Ascension. Ask questions from the big book. TB P135 – PPT Jesus says farewell & PPT the Ascension</p> <p>Possible tasks – Artwork to represent the Ascension PB P136 Jesus goes back to heaven worksheet & pictures to sequence worksheet Retell the Ascension Ascension storyboard</p>	<p>U1.5.4. Recognise that Catholics celebrate the Ascension of Jesus and Pentecost on special days called holydays. (RVE)</p> <p>Have you ever been out in a storm? Have you ever heard thunder? Have you ever heard lightning? What was it like? Big Book P29 – Pentecost Ask questions from the big book.</p> <p>Read text to the children about the Apostles and Jesus' promise.</p> <p>TB P140 PPT Pentecost Ask questions on P140 – can the children answer the questions? Assess their understanding.</p> <p>Possible tasks – Hot seating (Apostles – Pentecost) or role play the Pentecost Before & after the Pentecost (thoughts & feelings) PB P141 worksheets sequencing Learn the song 'sing for joy' Sing for Joy</p>	<p>U1.5.3. Make simple connections between the mission of the Church and the mission of Jesus as he announced it at the beginning of Luke's Gospel (Lk 4:16-19). (See branch 3.) Respond (all three objectives). R1.5.2. Hearing the words of the Glory Be and hymns that reference Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and joining in prayerfully if they choose to do so.</p> <p>Big Book P30 – the Apostles telling the crowds about Jesus. Ask questions on P30. Explain to children they will hear what happened after Pentecost. Discuss the word 'mission' and explain to the children they will find out what the Apostles mission was.</p> <p>TB P147 PPT The Mission of the Church</p> <p>Possible tasks – How can we pray/share/help Teach the Glory Be prayer (children to learn words and fill gaps) How is the mission of the church carried on today?
