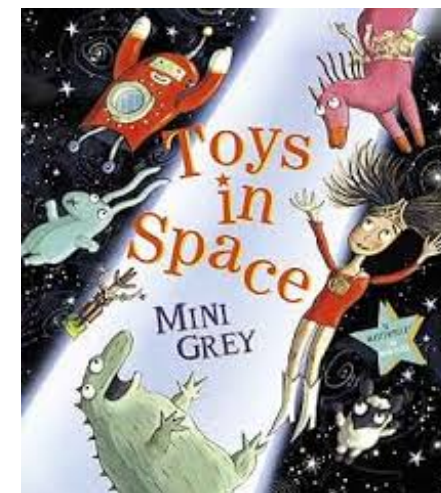
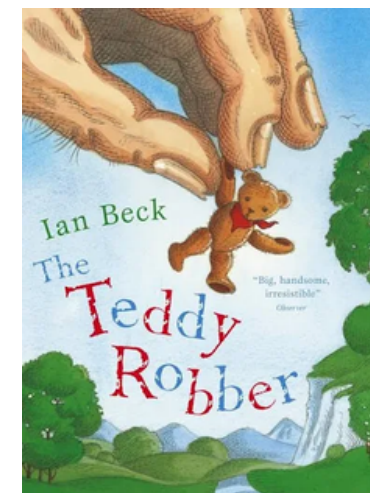
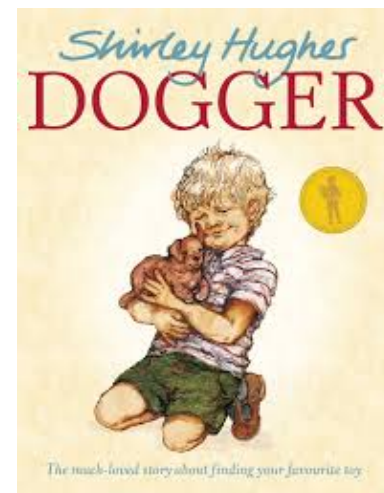
### Literacy

Children will write some or all of their name.

Children will write some letters accurately.

Children will begin to identify some grapheme-phoneme correspondences.

Phonics: s,a,t,p,i,n,m,d.



### Understanding the World

Children will explore toys and their materials.

Children will learn about toys from the past.

Children will learn about summer seasonal changes.

Children will learn about different jobs in the community.

Children will go on a visit to a farm and the church.

RE: Dialogue and Encounter - being good neighbours.

### Mathematics

Children will learn accurate and consistent counting to 10.

Children will learn to separate a group of three or four objects in different ways.

Children will learn to make equal sets.

Children will learn to understand and use specific attributes for capacity (full, empty, part, full).

Children will learn to understand and use the language of distance.

Children will begin to notice properties of 2D shapes and find shapes that are the same, including on the faces of 3D shapes.

### Expressive Arts and Design

Children will make their own toys and puppets.

Children will create their own toy instruments and use them to make music.

Children will explore tuned instruments and sing along to familiar songs.

Children will use props and puppets to retell stories.
